



Alyssa Ward, Ph.D., LCP is the Behavioral Health Clinical Director at the Department of Medical Assistance Services, overseeing all aspects of policy and regulation related to the Virginia Medicaid Behavioral Health Program. Dr. Ward oversees the Addiction Recovery Treatment Services (ARTS) program and the SUPPORT ACT grant, which has brought 5 million dollars to Virginia to support provider capacity for substance use disorder treatment. Dr. Ward also serves as the agency lead for Project BRAVO (Behavioral Health Redesign for Access, Values and Outcomes), an effort to transform the Medicaid behavioral health services array into a robust continuum of evidence-based, trauma-informed, prevention-focused and recovery-oriented care. Dr. Ward is a Licensed Clinical Psychologist with experiences as a clinician, supervisor, trainer, administrator and implementation

researcher in the areas of evidence-based practice (EBP) and trauma-informed care in community settings. Dr. Ward received her Ph.D. from Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU), completed her residency at University of North Carolina Chapel Hill and fellowships at both The University of Hawaii and the University of California Los Angeles. Most recently, Dr. Ward was an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at VCU and she continues to be affiliate faculty within the School of Medicine, Department of Pediatrics.
