- We started with 22 founding members in 2004 to the current 70+ members in 2011.
- Our members consist of senior community agency staff, state agency employees, family caregivers, and university and independent researchers.
- In 2011 Virginia was the recipient of a grant from the ARCH Lifespan Respite Technical Assistance Center for the VCC to coordinate a Lifespan Respite Summit.
- The Virginia Caregiver Coalition is now a partner with the Virginia Department for the Aging to implement Virginia's Lifespan Respite Care Program.
